Leeuwin Estate Riesling

WHITE BLENDS

Evans and Tate Margaret River Classic \$32.00 \$8.50

Margaret River. WA

Clean, fresh and spicy lees dominate this light blend, giving a scallion edge to the dry, lasting flavour. This popular white wine is the perfect partner for mild, spicy indian cuisine, especially with a seafood base.

Lenton Brae Semillon Sauvignon Blanc 2005 \$40.00

These guys have established the benchmark for the SSB blend in Margaret River. Beautiful rounded and full but with a fine crisp acid sustaining the finish. Absolutely reliable at the top end of its class.

Cape Mentelle Semillon Sauvignon Blanc \$40.00

Margaret River. WA

One of the first of these blends and still one of the very best. The superb quality of Maragret River fruit provides the basis for this outstanding wine. Incredible intensity on the nose showing strong tropical fruit characters with a faint herbaceous dusting. The palate delivers a powerful and lingering flavour.

UNWOODED CHARDONNAY

Montgomery Hill Unwooded Chardonnay 2006 \$40.00

Albany. WA

A clear pale green colour with just a hint of gold. Strong aromas of melon with subtle odours of ripe peach and hints of fresh apples.

CHARDONNAY

Margaret River. WA

It has a sultry cinnamon character on the nose, and stony, even limey flavours along with some white peach on the palate. It's a zesty structured wine. The palate has remarkable persistence and balance. Excellent with mild chicken curry and any seafood dish, particularly prawns.

This wine has lively green apple flavours adorned with an essence of lime citrus, an elegant texture and a mineral edge.

Heathcote. VIC

Penfolds Bin 28 2002 \$52.00

One of Australia's most famous wines that year in and tear out provides consistency in both style and quality. A powerful full-bodied style with lush robust fruit and ample tannin and oak structure.

Old Kent River Backtrack Shiraz 2004 \$38.00 \$9.50

Frankland River. WA

Bright red-purple hue, lovely red fruits bouquet leading to an intense medium bodied palate of red fruits, spices and good length.

CABARNET SAUVIGNON

Alkoomi Cabernet Sauvignon \$38.00 \$9.50

Frankland River. WA

Consistently one of the better WA cabernets. It shows rich, intense, dark berry and cassis aromas with subtle cherry French oak overtones. The palate delivers a full bodied mix of sweet, dark cherry and chocolate fruit flavours with finely structured tannins. Handles savoury spicy food really well.

Killerby Cabernet Sauvignon 2004 \$40.00

Margaret River. WA

The palate shows stylish blackcurrant, berry and chocolate flavours with length and depth. French oak maturation has filled out the palate and given a subtle smoky background.

CABARNET MERLOT

Evans and Tate \$42.00 \$11.50

Margaret River. WA

Deep, dark and dense. This is a powerful wine delivered with finesse and style. Aromas of ground coffee, chocolate and savoury spice provide compelling interest. The palate has great mouthfeel with complex multi layered flavours supported with solid integrated oak and fine acid. Good with any Tandoor oven food.

Cape Mentelle Trinders \$56.00

Margaret River. WA

This is a beautiful blend of cabernet and merlot with the firm and elegant character of cabernet worked neatly into the lush fruits of the merlot. Strongly fruit driven though with a degree of tannin and assertiveness providing structure and style. A class act.
